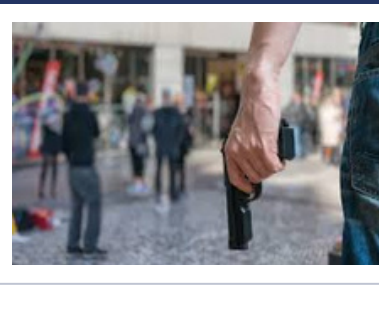

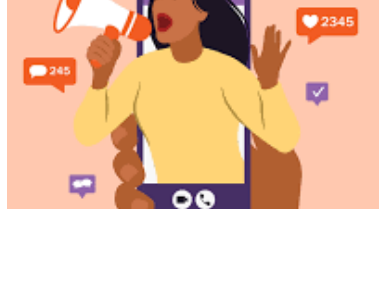


Stop the Bleed Orientation

Examines planning and preparedness considerations and explores the procedures and considerations for mass fatality management in a healthcare facility

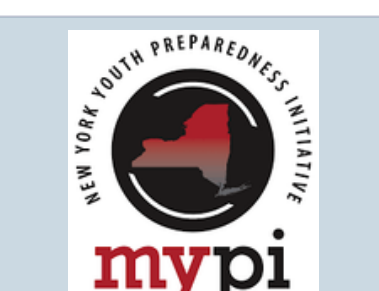


Tactical Decontamination for Law Enforcement

Webinar - NYS Vital Signs Academy

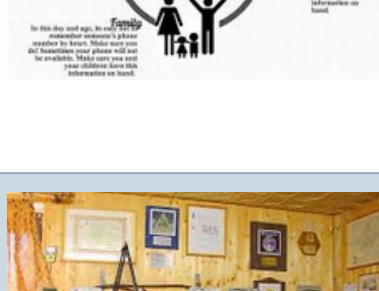

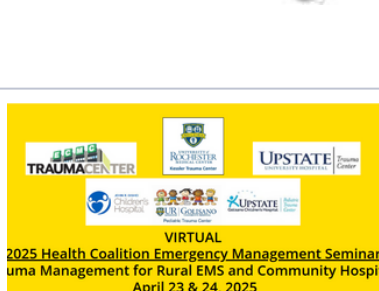


I-400: ICS For Complex Incidents

CTI-502: eFINDS

Provides a demonstration of eFINDS application including: eFINDS Data Reporter and eFINDS Data Administrator role permissions; how to register a patient/resident with a scanner and without; use a spreadsheet to register multiple patient/residents; update patient/resident tracking information as an evacuating facility, and as a receiving facility

Provide guidance and tools to support resiliency in healthcare workers, with a focus on LTC staff, in the face of emergencies and disasters

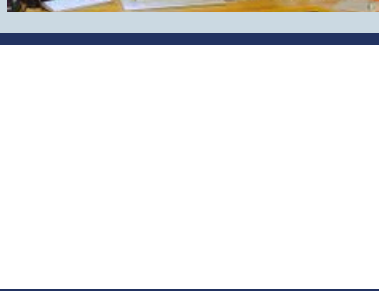


Advanced Trauma Life Support
